1. *Registration to attend services* - We no longer issue paper tickets. Members are welcome at all services; we know who you are. If you'd like to bring family members and guests, please fill out the registration form. You and your family and guests will be greeted at the door, and once your name is found on the list you will enter the sanctuary. Our children and grandchildren (ages 5-12) are welcome at no charge at Kol Nefesh family services. However, we need the names of the children, and of the adult who will be accompanying them. Members of your immediate family are welcome and encouraged to attend services with you at no additional cost. Immediate family members are children, grandchildren and parents. Spouses of single members are welcome to attend with the purchase of a \$225 guest ticket. As always, students and members of the armed services are welcome to worship with us as our guests at no charge. If you know of any Jewish students or military personnel who cannot get home for the High Holy Days, please invite them to come and worship with us and add their names to the attendance registration form. High Holy Day admission for non-members is available at \$225 per person. If you plan to invite extended family or friends, insert the appropriate information on the attendance registration form and enclose your check.  
**Note:** Dues must be paid in full in order to be placed on the list to attend High Holy Days. If you are not sure about your dues balance, please contact Lin Mascia at the Bet Aviv office, 410-992-9994 or [office@betaviv.org](mailto:office@betaviv.org).
2. *Book of Remembrance* – We want to be sure that all of your loved ones' names are included and spelled correctly. If you got an electronic High Holy Days form, please check the names and submit the form electronically. If you got a paper form in the mail, please **mail back the form to make any changes or to confirm that the listing is correct**. If you have trouble accessing the name list, please contact Laura and Bill Salganik, [salganik2@gamil.com](mailto:salganik2@gamil.com) or 410-964-5125. Because of printer deadlines, the form must be returned on time. **This form must be returned even if there have been no changes.**
3. *Break-the-Fast* – Our congregation-wide Yom Kippur Break-the-Fast buffet will follow the Ne'ilah service. I encourage you to join us at The Meeting House for this catered, warm, delicious, and easy way to break your fast. There will be a charge of \$22 for adults and \$10 for children ages 12 and under. There will be no charge for children ages 5 and under. If you would like to attend, complete the Break-the-Fast form and send it to the office, along with your check, no later than August 24, 2018.

I ask that all members bring their new High Holy Day prayer books to services as Bet Aviv has a limited number of books reserved for guests. If you need to purchase books at \$30 per set, please call the Bet Aviv Office to make arrangements.

We will continue our special program on Yom Kippur afternoon during which a few congregants will share their unique life experiences. Their "Personal Journeys" will inspire us and enhance our spiritual journey and Yom Kippur reflection.

Bet Aviv again will provide a children's room with a babysitter. In addition, Kol Nefesh will provide a family service on the first day of Rosh Hashanah and on Yom Kippur morning. Parents must accompany all children to these family services. On both of these days, services will begin at 10:15 a.m. and conclude following the Torah parade. Be sure to indicate the names and ages of children that will be attending the family services on the service registration form.

The High Holy Days are a traditional time to make donations to honor a loved one, recognize a special event, or to assist Bet Aviv financially. You may direct your donation to our general fund or to one of our special funds which are listed on the Bet Aviv website at [www.betaviv.org](http://www.betaviv.org). For those of you who attend the Kol Nefesh Services with your grandchildren, this would also be a wonderful opportunity to donate to Kol Nefesh. These donations should be made payable to Kol Nefesh and sent to the Bet Aviv Office.

I look forward to sharing another year of worship, study, and friendship with the Bet Aviv family. The entire Board of Directors wishes you and yours a year of health, happiness, peace, and prosperity.
