



## **Bet Aviv High Holy Day Admission Policy**

**Policy:** Bet Aviv provides services on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur to members in good standing, their children and grandchildren, and their adult parents without additional charge. Members in good standing of Kol Nefesh may attend services to the same extent as Bet Aviv members. Others who wish to attend High Holy Day services may do so in accordance with the procedures set forth below.

**Procedure:**

- A. Extended family and friends of members: Members may purchase admission privileges for extended family (such as nieces, nephews, cousins, etc.) and friends without restriction on the number of years such admissions are purchased.
- B. Un-sponsored guests: Persons wishing to attend High Holiday Services by paying for admission directly and not through a member may do so for the High Holidays of one calendar year. Such admission shall be presumed to be for the purpose of auditioning the congregation for membership and the attendee shall anticipate communication from the membership committee prior to and following services.
- C. Members of URJ congregations: Members of an affiliated URJ congregation other than Bet Aviv may attend services by notifying Bet Aviv in advance and presenting a letter or comparable documentation verifying membership in a URJ congregation.
- D. Bet Aviv reserves the right to limit the number of paid admissions based on the capacity of the facility and on the needs of members, which remain primary.
- E. Prices for admission will be set by the Board. The Board may establish a price applicable to all services or may offer admissions to the Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur services separately, or both. In any year in which the Board takes no specific action to set admission prices, prices shall be the same as in the previous year.
- F. People who buy guest admissions on a "try out" basis who elect to apply for membership prior to the end of the fiscal year, shall have membership dues waived for the balance of the year in which they paid for High Holiday services, and may have the price of the admission applied to membership dues for the following calendar year. A person who does not commit to membership until the calendar year following the High Holidays for which admission is purchased shall not be entitled to application of admission fees toward membership.
