In Their Own Words: A Combined Biographical Statement from Rabbi Seth and Marsha Bernstein

We are both Midwesterners by birth. Seth is from Indianapolis, Indiana, where he graduated from North Central High School. Marsha is from Lincoln, Nebraska where she graduated from Lincoln High. Both of us were active in our synagogues and Jewish youth groups. We met at the end of our freshman years at Indiana University and were married in 1970 before our senior years of college. Seth majored in History and Marsha in English with an Education Degree.



At the end of his senior year, Seth was accepted to Hebrew Union College after which we moved to Israel for a year. We returned to Cincinnati to complete Seth's rabbinic studies. However, in the course of these studies, he took a year off and we moved to Washington, DC where he entered INTERMET, an Interfaith Seminary. We then returned to Cincinnati. Both Michael and Jana were born in Cincinnati. Marsha worked at a diamond manufacturing company and typed dissertations on the side. Seth had multiple jobs during that time, including serving pulpits in Columbus, Ohio; Muncie, Indiana; Schulenburg, Texas, Owensboro, Kentucky, and a maximum security prison in Lucasville, Ohio.

Seth was ordained in 1977 and our family moved to New York City where Seth was an Assistant and then Associate Rabbi at Congregation Rodeph Sholom on the Upper West Side. Marsha continued typing dissertations and books at home and also worked part-time at the Temple and for a local caterer.

In 1986 the family moved to Worcester, MA, where Seth served for 25 years at Temple Sinai. Marsha worked at a local private middle and high school, Worcester Academy, serving as the Associate Director of Admission and International Student Director. During our years in Massachusetts, Seth earned a Doctor of Ministry at Andover Newton Theological School. He also served as the Jewish Chaplain at UMASS/Memorial Hospital and the Hospice Chaplain at the Jewish Healthcare Center. After years of training, Seth became a Board Certified Chaplain, specializing in Disaster Spiritual Care with the American Red Cross.

While in Worcester, both Michael and Jana were married in 1999. Michael is married to Daphna Straus. They have two children, Allie (13) and Theo (10) and live in Manhattan with their dog, Maisy. Jana married a local "Worcester boy," Jeremy Sharp. They live in Kensington with their two children, Sam (13) and Eve (10) and their dog, Teddy.

Fortunately, Seth was offered this rabbinic position at Bet Aviv in 2011. Marsha first worked part-time at a doctor's office but in 2016 she started working for Sharp Insight, Jana's business. In addition to serving as Rabbi at Bet Aviv, Seth has taken great pleasure in being part of the Oakland Mills Interfaith Center. In his "off" hours, Seth is on the faculty of Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in New York in their Doctor of Ministry Program and he is Chair of the Board of Appeals of the Central Conference of American Rabbis. He plans to continue his teaching at HUC-JIR and work with the CCAR. Since moving to Leisure World, Marsha has taken on the job of Treasurer of the Jewish Residents of Leisure World.
